Cupcake Liner Flowers

Supplies:

Cupcake liners - any size, color, or design

Construction paper

Glue and scissors

Green pipe cleaners, popsicle sticks, ribbons, or markers

Any additional decorations (buttons, glitter, doilies, etc.)



Directions:

1. Select the cupcake liners you want to use as a flower.
2. Cut, color, or design the colorful tops any way you want.
3. Prepare the green pipe cleaners or popsicle sticks to use as stems.
4. Glue the stems to your construction paper, or use a green marker to draw a stem.
5. Glue the cupcake liners to your paper, above the stem.
6. Add any glitter or final creative touches to your flower.
7. Let dry on a flat surface like a shelf or table.
8. Give your flowers to someone to brighten their day!
